ABOUT GIANT STEPS

Giant Steps offers life-changing experiences to people of all ages who live with a wide range of disabilities, as well as to veterans living with post-traumatic stress disorder. Each week our riders come from throughout the Bay Area to interact with their 1,000 pound "therapists" in a safe and secure environment to achieve goals never before dreamed possible.

Our program offers our riders a unique opportunity to focus *not on their limitations, but on what they can do*, and the results are extraordinary. We operate without state or federal funding, so rely on the generosity of private donors to continue to serve the most deserving members of our community.

A MESSAGE FROM THE CO-CHAIRS

Welcome to the 4th Annual Giant Steps Charity Classic gala. We are honored and humbled by your continued support, and we thank you for joining us tonight.

2013 has been a year of growth for Giant Steps. We now serve a record number of riders who come to us from seven Bay Area counties to experience the benefits of therapeutic riding. We've launched partnerships with Wounded Warriors and Swords to Plowshares to serve veterans living with post-traumatic stress disorder. Upwards of 200 community volunteers donate their time to our organization; and since last year's gala, we have added new instructors, new board members and new horses to support our continued growth and impact in the coming year.

FRITZ HATTON, Auctioneer

Fritz Hatton is the one of the nation's leading wine Auctioneers. His wine auction experience commenced in 1980, when he joined Christie's to help start its U.S. Wine Department. After a musical sabbatical in the early 1990s, he returned to Christie's and served as the Director of their U.S. Wine Department from 1995 to 1998. In this capacity and in partnership with the leading American wine retailer Zachys, he was responsible for the largest auctions of wine organized to date



in the United States. In 2002 he joined the prominent retailer Zachys as auctioneer for its new solo wine auction venture and continues to serve as Zachys' principal auctioneer. Since 1983 Mr. Hatton has conducted charity auctions throughout the U.S., most involving wine in support of arts, educational, and medical charities.

In the fall of 1998 Mr. Hatton became a vintner when he returned to California to launch Arietta, a microbrand featuring handmade Bordeaux-styled Napa red wines. He now resides in Saint Helena with his wife Caren, eleven-year-old daughter Libby, and seven-year-old daughter Hattie. In rare moments away from selling wine, he pursues his hobby as an amateur classical pianist, and has recently performed with pianists Garrick Ohlsson and Emmanuel Ax, and the soprano Barbara Bonney.

SILENT AUCTION

- Each item has a bid sheet placed in front of it.
- Persons wishing to bid may do so by legibly writing their bid number and name on the bid sheet.
- There is no limit to the number of times a person can bid on an item.
- Please read the time specifications & restrictions carefully.
- Revisit each item frequently to check your bid and rebid if you would like.
- Each new bid must be written on the first available line on the bid sheet and must meet the 'minimum raise' shown on the bid sheet. Bids that do not meet the minimum raise will not be considered.
- Under no circumstances may any bid sheet be removed from the table.
- All written bids are final and may not be retracted.


- To enter a bid, the bidding number should be raised with the bid number facing the auctioneer.






